1. <u>Donald & Sharon Cundy</u> – Map 38, Lot 5 & DOT ROW. Install a 4' x 30' Seasonal lift-out dock anchored to existing rock. Install steps down banking with landings 3'x3' on top and bottom. Wetlands Impact Dock =120 sq ft. Stairs and Landing 108 sq ft. +/-.

Minimum Impact Expedited:

Repair of an existing beach by replenishing beach with not more than 10 cubic yards of sand and repair/clean-out of an existing drainage swale permitted under 1999-02569 along an approximate 151' shoreline frontage. Shoreland Permit Application:

1. <u>David and Susan Benson</u> – Map 21A, Lot 4. 34 Piper's Point Lane. Razing of existing garage and construction of a new garage located mostly within existing footprint. Other activity proposed within the Protected Shoreland includes re-sodding an existing lawn and minor excavation in the driveway to improve an existing drainage issue. Proposed permanent impacts: 690 SF; proposed temporary impacts: 4,302 SF

- 1. <u>David Lawrence</u> All the LCIP Monitoring Reports have been sent to NHDES electronically also Dave left a message for Ron Arsenault (Fish & Game) stating the Commission was going to have a public hearing concerning the No Hunting in the Town Forest and would contact him when there is a date set. Russ Wilder volunteered to compose a draft management plan for the Town Forest to have for the hearing. The Commission will continue this discussion at the next Conservation meeting after review of the draft management plan.
- 2. Russ Wilder Follow up on conversation with the state regarding the Stockbridge Corner Rd. project. The State had \$41,000 dollars that they were going to put in the ARM Fund after hearing no response from the letter DOT sent to the Commission in August. Russ called DOT and spoke with Kevin Nyhan and asked if the Town of Alton could be considered for a water quality project at the Alton Circle, maybe a water quality retention basin as part of the Stockbridge corner project. All the water coming from center of town and all the water from Hannafords all ends in the middle of the traffic circle. Kevin said he would contact Lori Sommer at DES to see what she had to say and he would get back to us. Also a design might have to be drawn up. Does the Commission want to pursue this? The Commission agreed.
