- 43 Chair noted that questions from the public would be addressed by the Board at the public hearing on
- 44 April 15th. He instructed the public to sign a waiver prior to proceeding with the site walk. Atty.
- 45 Cronin noted that they would also not be answering questions from the public at this time. The
- 46 architect noted that signs were located throughout the property showing portions of the plan. He also
- 47 noted that the walk was rough terrain, and that people were to move forward at their own risk.

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- 49 The first stop during the walk was the existing logging bridge over the running brook. It was noted that
- 50 was where the covered bridge was to be constructed. It was then noted that the tote road that was being
- 51 walked on was going to become the main road. We were shown where the lower lots to the left were to
- 52 be located. It was noted that you couldn't see the lake until you were up on top of the ridge; they were
- 53 currently in the valley.

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- 55 Ms. MacArthur pointed out to the property owners that someone was taking photographs of the site and
- 56 that it stated in the waiver that no photographs were allowed. Mr. Buonopane spoke to the person
- 57 filming and reminded them of the disclaimer on the waiver. Chair reminded the public that the waiver
- 58 included a clause that no photographs were allowed.

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A member of the public asked for clarification on the number of lots; there are 18 lots, not 19.

62 At another stop, it was noted that it was the first proposed house, which would be tucked into the

- 63 woods. An inquiry was made as to where the brook water came from; from all over the property. A
- 64 question was asked of the public and they were told that they should hold off on their question until the
- 65 public hearing.

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- 67 The walk led the people to where the end of the road would then turn into a driveway. An inquiry was
- 68 made as to why the road split twice; it was due to a frontage requirement. It was asked how long the
- 69 driveway would be; 1,200'. It was noted that the driveway would be 16' wide. The walk then
- 70 proceeded up to the top.

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- 72 It was noted that the houses on the top of the property would be off to the side of the hill. From the
- 73 lake, the houses could be seen. The Board was led to where the houses would be located, and they had
- 74 the opportunity to see where the tree line was abutting the Casale's property; it was noted that beyond
- 75 the tree line, it pitched down even further than where everyone was standing. There was a thick row of
- 76 trees between the Casale's house and the tree line; there would be no further clearing of trees than what
- 77 existed currently along the tree line along the Casale's property line. It was noted that the Casale's
- 78 house was approximately 1,000' away from where the house to the left was proposed to be constructed.
- 79 There are about 300 trees proposed to be planted on the property. At this point, everyone headed down
- 80 to the parking area.

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82 Chair closed the meeting at 12:15+/- PM.
